PHCH 150 Introduction to Public and Community Health

Explores two key questions: "What is the agenda of public health?" and "Is health a right or a privilege?" Through discussions and activities, students will examine the biological, political, and sociological factors shaping health in the U.S. The course emphasizes understanding public health as a system and its interdisciplinary links to other fields. Critical thinking and analysis of major public health issues will be a central focus throughout the semester.

PHCH 312 Epidemiology

PHCH 340 Comparative Healthcare

4 cr

Compares healthcare systems and organizations in two Pan-American countries; to gain comprehensive understanding of universal health systems, their challenges, and solutions. Students explore healthcare history, the role of government, and cultural impacts on health trends through discussions, guest lectures, facility visits, and service-learning. Topics include healthcare delivery, funding models, workforce issues, & health outcomes. Includes required travel component to one of the two countries and additional fees.

Prerequisite: Junior status, instructor approval **Attributes:** Additional Fees Apply (FEE)

PHCH 350 Health Communication

3 cr

Examines how communication affects and is intertwined with issues of health, medicine and ethics. Communication will be discussed on a personal, intimate level in the way patients and caregivers interact in the examination and hospital room; at the organizational level, in the way policies and community relations affect how health care is provided and how people feel about providers; and in media campaigns that seek to educate people about health.

Prerequisite: Junior status

PHCH 350H Honors: Health Communication

3 cr

Examines how communication affects and is intertwined with issues of health, medicine and ethics. Communication will be discussed on a personal, intimate level in the way patients and caregivers interact in the examination and hospital room; at the organizational level, in the way policies and community relations affect how health care is provided and how people feel about providers; and in media campaigns that seek to educate people about health.

PHCH 412 Research Methods in Epidemiology

3 cr

Introduces the student to research methods in the field of epidemiology. Students will learn the value of research methodology as applied to the field of epidemiology with a focus on concepts and interpretation of basic research design and statistical analysis.

Prerequisite: BIOL 312 or PHCP 312 and junior status

PHCH 540 Internship in Community Health Education

Provides students with hands-on experience outside of the college in the field of community health and wellness. The student will work with a faculty sponsor and an off-campus supervisor, as appropriate. Repeatable up to 12 credits.
